Early Worship

Every Sunday at 9.00am

If you're looking for a short but meaningful service with hymns, teaching and time for reflection, this service could be for you!

We use an authorised Church of England format, in modern language yet with traditional elements like the Lord's Prayer, Confession and Gloria. Eucharist is on the first and third Sunday of the month and at major Festivals such as Christmas and Easter, with a Service of The Word at other times.

The service lasts for 25-30 minutes, has a welcoming, friendly atmosphere, and plenty of time to meet people and chat after the service. It's suitable for families, those who want a simpler service than our Parish Mass at 10.30am and for anyone wanting an early service on a Sunday!

We also run workshops aimed at our younger (and older!) members of the congregation at important church seasons like Advent and Lent. This gives us the opportunity to explore the stories and traditions of these seasons, do some craft work, and enjoy games and refreshments together.

The Early Worship Team would like to thank a great host of supporters.

The service benefits enormously from the wide range of people who take the services and those who give the 5-minute Reflection. The support and enthusiasm comes, not only from our wonderful Ministry Team, but from the Ordinands too. June has been a merry month for the Early Service.

The Keyboard Team (Martin Robinson, Charles Dalglish and John Davenport) are a deeply integral part of our worship – each Sunday, we sing The Gloria, The Kyrie (often to a Ukranian tune), the Sanctus and Benedictus, as well as two carefully chosen hymns.

The Reading is usually read by a member of the congregation, including children. And the Intercessions are often congregation-led, with some children enjoying using the Prayer bell.

Children are also delighted to light and extinguish the candles – not so easy when you are quite small.

The Churchwardens continue to be the backbone of this service – each Sunday they arrive at Church much earlier than anyone else to ensure all is ready.

While our biggest **thanks** goes to those families who manage to get their children to this service – not every Sunday, not always on time, but remarkably regularly.

Plans for Teaching in August



The Early Worship service is also an excellent teaching opportunity. This summer, we shall be focusing on Journeying with St Paul.

Starting on the 30th July and continuing in the four Sundays of August, EW services will be exploring the Travels of St Paul and the establishment of the early Christian churches in the first century AD - excitements, surprises, danger, narrow escapes and derring-do, geography, history and language.

Harvest Workshop

We have a long tradition of workshops for significant seasons in the Church's year. The next one is planned for September 24th and will focus on the theme of Harvest-Food for All.

Summer Flowers and Music is on Saturday the 12th of August from 3.30 to 6.00pm


