

Remembering the Korean War: This year marks 70 years since fighting in the Korean War came to an end.

The 'Forgotten War'



27th July is the anniversary of the armistice of what many call 'the Forgotten War'. It was overshadowed by the end of the Second World War and the subsequent 'Cold War', and yet the sacrifice of the allied Armed Forces was extremely high, and its legacy still has a global impact.

Following the end of Japanese occupation in 1945 it was agreed by the United States and the Soviet Union to divide Korea into two occupation zones.

What was intended as a temporary border resulted in partition: the communist Democratic People's Republic of Korea (North Korea) and the American-backed Republic of Korea (South Korea). **William Swarbrick** of 20 Field Regiment, Royal Artillery arrived in Korea in February 1953. He recalls:

"When I came home after being away for 12 months there was no home coming party. When I met friends and they said that they hadn't seen me for a while, I told them I had been to Korea. They usually asked where it was in the world. I don't think many people knew about the Korean War and it came to be known as the 'Forgotten War'."

The new governments claimed rule over all of Korea and neither accepted the border as permanent. On 25th June 1950, after years of clashes along the border, the North Korean People's Army invaded South Korea, overwhelming the south's forces. In response, the USA called on the United Nations Security Council to invoke the UN Charter and declare the North Koreans as aggressors. This would be the first war in which the UN took an active involvement and called on all members to help the



South. The USA was the first to respond with UN combat troops to support South Korea, followed by a further 14 nations, including the UK.

The poppy is a symbol of Remembrance and hope, including hope for a positive future and peaceful world.

In the spring of 1915, shortly after losing a friend in Ypres, a Canadian doctor, Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae wrote his now famous poem after seeing poppies growing in battle-scarred fields.

In Flanders Fields

John McCrae

In Flanders' fields the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row, That mark our place: and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard amid the guns below.

We are the dead. Short days ago We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow, Loved and were loved, and now we lie In Flanders' fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe; To you from failing hands we throw The torch; be yours to hold it high, If ye break faith with us who die We shall not sleep, though poppies grow In Flanders' Fields.


