### **Archdeacon Christine Froude**

The farewell service to celebrate the ministry of 'The Venerable Christine Froude, Archdeacon of Malmesbury, will take place (at Malmesbury) next Saturday (22 September). Andrew Morgan and Fr Charles will be present to represent this parish – the Abbey seating is rather limited (!) so it's 'a ticket only do'.

Archdeacon Christine, in her ministry, has had an extraordinarily significant impact on this diocese. She has blended real pastoral strength with the wisdom to navigate through what is often choppy church water, and she has the ability to be firm when required and yet know that whilst rules are rules most issues can be solved through intelligent and respectful dialogue. Her ministry in the diocese will be missed.

Christine has also been a real friend to All Saints, she has stood alongside us over a number of years in which there have been vacancies and other changes that have had some impact on us. She also has the distinction of being the first woman priest to be Principal Celebrant at the ASC High Altar.

We wish Christine and David all the very best in retirement and look forward to seeing them in the not-to-distant future.

### **Canon Professor Mark Chapman**

Fr Mark is a very distinguished Oxford academic, teaching modern church history and theology. He is also the author of numerous books and journal papers.

We are really fortunate in having him deliver the final 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary presentation on Saturday 29 September (at 4.00pm). His subject is 'Catholic Renewal Lives On'. Please make a note in your diaries as this will be excellent in both content and performance.

Interestingly this theme, and the timing of it, resonates with two major international conferences on the impact of the exploration of the catholic roots in the Anglican Communion. One Conference is taking place in Boston MA, during All Saintstide and the other in London (this last week - September 18-20). Both conferences emphasise the significance of mission and evangelism, the place of the spiritual dimension and our engagement with communities.

I'm pleased to say that Fr Mark will stay over to be with us on Sunday 30 September to preach and celebrate at Parish Mass.


