The United Society Partners in the Gospel was founded in 1701. It is the Anglican mission agency that partners churches and communities worldwide in God's mission to enliven faith, strengthen relationships, unlock potential and champion justice.

- The desperate flight of migrants.
- Forced displacement of people at record levels.




