It is very straightforward, and a good way to get to know people. Coffee, tea, milk, and sugar are provided. All other items needed are in the kitchen off the Atrium. There is a dishwasher for the cups afterwards the kitchen. There will now be no need to collect payment or donations - anyone wishing to donate may do so via other collection points in the Church.

The Julian Trust Night Shelter is at last fully open following a two year forced shutdown due to Covid. I am aware that newer members of our congregation may not know of its existence or its function.

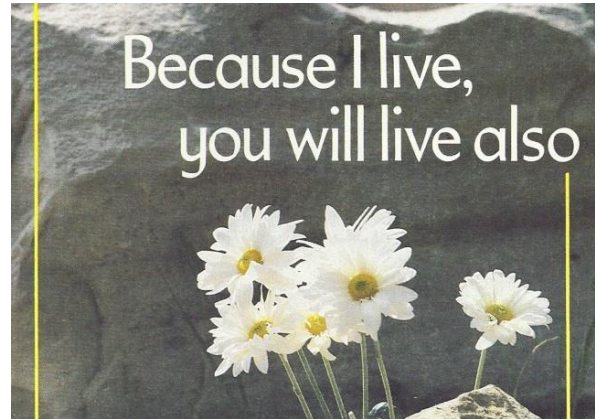

Mon 16	Caroline Chisholm 1877 Pray for those who dedicate themselves to Humanitarian issues (especially today those working with female immigrants in Australia and on Aboriginal issues). Pray for immigrant populations throughout our world and for those who are further disadvantaged by race.
Tue 17	Pray for all Pilgrims. Especially those who find meaning, clarity and peace at Walsingham, pray for the Walsingham Cells. Remember all those who worship through journeying and finding Holy places
