Mon August 1	Give thanks for the transformational gift of the World Wide Web. Recognise those whose lives have been transformed by the ability to have access to information, knowledge and learning; those who manage to maintain and grow connections between friends, families, learning networks; those who provide reasoned and real-time insights into world events. Pray for all who work in the digital world. Pray for those who become victims of this gift through its 'wrong use' – abuse, bullying and fraud.
Tue 2	Pray for those who suffer from lung cancer (this is world lung cancer day) and for their friends and families. Pray for those who research this disease, for medical practitioners who work with sufferers and their families and for all who suffer from respiratory conditions.

Sat 6	The Transfiguration of our Lord The Transfiguration is a pivotal moment, and the setting on the mountain is presented as the point where human nature meets God: the meeting place for the temporal and the eternal, with Jesus himself as the connecting point, acting as the bridge between heaven and earth. Please take time to reflect on the meaning of this in the way we live our Christian lives.
Sunday 7	The Transfiguration - 8th after Trinity Father in heaven, whose Son Jesus Christ was wonderfully transfigured before chosen witnesses upon the holy mountain, and spoke of the exodus he would accomplish at Jerusalem: give us strength so to hear his voice and bear our cross that in the world to come we may see him as he is; Early Worship 9.00am Parish Mass 10.30am
