Thousands of buildings, including hospitals and schools, have collapsed and infrastructure has been badly damaged. Local responders are desperately searching through the rubble for survivors. There are 17 Million people live in the affected area, many in urgent need of shelter, food and medical aid.

The service will be followed by a bring and share buffet in the Atrium.


