Cathedral Confirmation

During the Easter Vigil at Bristol Cathedral two of our congregation will be confirmed:

Thomas and Michael Thorp

They, and brother and parents, are active members of Early Worship which takes place every Sunday at 9.00am. They are being supported by Jessica Smith LLM, who is delivering the Confirmation Preparation and some members of the congregation who will be present for the Cathedral Easter Vigil.

We hold them, their parents, families and friends in our prayers. As we do all who are confirmed alongside them and those confirmed here at ASC a few weeks ago,

The Easter Vigil

A vigil Mass is held after nightfall on Holy Saturday, (or sometimes before dawn on Easter Sunday) in celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. This is called the Easter Vigil: the most glorious, beautiful, and dramatic liturgy for the Church.

The vigil is divided into four parts:



- Service of Light, we gather outside church to light the Paschal fire and then the Paschal Candle as we contemplate the Light of Christ that has Come Into the World
- Liturgy of the Word, we remind ourselves of the prophetic words that pointed toward the coming of the Messiah and the meaning of his life, death and resurrection
- Liturgy of Baptism, once again we renew our Baptismal vows, reminding ourselves of the promise and hope of salvation
- Liturgy of the Eucharist, we relive the final meal of Jesus and his Disciples and give thanks for his sacrifice for the salvation of all

The Paschal Candle Nails

During the Liturgy of the Easter Vigil this Saturday evening, we will light the Paschal candle. Traditionally it is the largest candle in a worship space – Salisbury Cathedral's Paschal Candle was regularly thirty-six feet tall (11 metres). As you are aware the candle will display several common symbols:

- The cross, which is the most prominent symbol and most clearly identifies it as the Paschal candle
- The Greek letters alpha and omega, which symbolize that God is the beginning and the end (from the Book of Revelation)
- The year when the particular candle is being used, which represents God amidst the present congregation and community
- Five nails with grains of incense (most often red), which are embedded in the candle often (as in our case) held within the "nails". These represent the five wounds of Jesus: the three nails that pierced his hands and feet, the spear thrust into his side, and the thorns that crowned his head

New Nails Gifted!



As you may be aware, we like many other churches have been subject to the attention of the candle thief. This person has previously taken the 'big six' and the Paschal Candle – this is why the Big Six have been temporally replaced with wooden candles. The theft of the Paschal Candle also led to the loss of one of the nails (or studs).

A new set of replacement nails will be blessed and used at the Easter Vigil. They are a gift from Swarna Simpson in memory of her parents whose Fiftieth Anniversary of death it is this year. Swarna's parents are Chellathuri and Athisayam Arulanantham.

The Coronation will take place of Saturday 6 May, it is a ceremony steeped in centuries of tradition and rich in Christian symbols and values. To mark this important moment in our nation's life, the Church of England has compiled a series of Daily Prayers.

Within this small booklet there is a very relevant and appropriate daily theme; which contains a reading, reflection and prayer for use by individuals and groups (or churches).

- * pray for The King, our nation and the world and its needs
- explore the symbolism of the Coronation Service and what this all means
- reflect on Jesus, the Servant King, and how this impacts on what we and the Church do

Easter Monday Walk: Paradise Bottom, led by Mike Benton




The target of the walk seems somehow appropriate for Easter Monday.


After lunch, we will meander past the Abbot's Pool, and back to base either directly across the fields or through Ashton Court. Dogs and children are encouraged.


