Congratulations to Michael and Thomas Thorp who were confirmed by the Bishop on Saturday night in the Cathedral Easter Vigil.

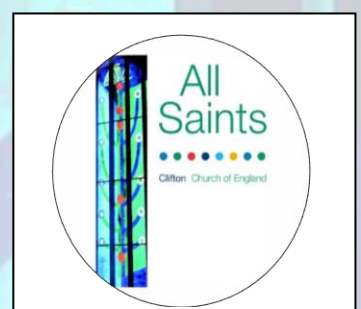
The Thorp family are active members of Early Worship which takes place every Sunday at 9.00am.

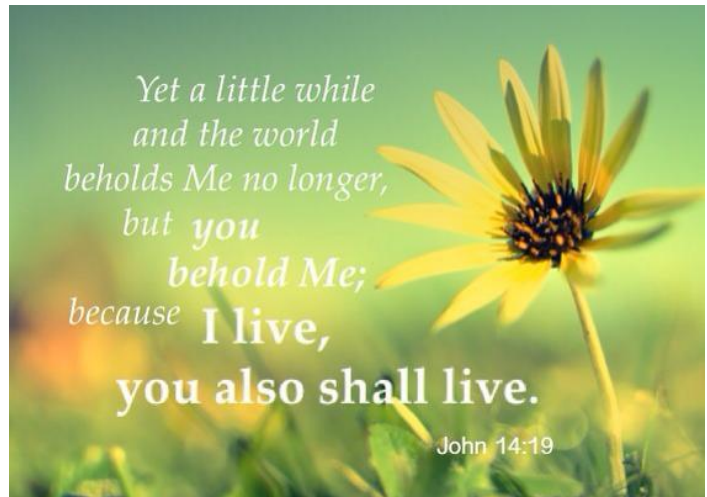
Fr Charles is away from Friday 14<sup>th</sup> of April. He returns on Wednesday the 19<sup>th</sup> of April.

# ALL SAINTS PRAYERS

Mon 17	This is about the time that bats emerge from hibernation. Bats play an important role in many environments around the world. Some plants depend partly or wholly on bats to pollinate their flowers or spread their seeds, while other bats also help control pests by eating insects. Pray for all who are involved in bat research and conservation.
Tue 18	Pray for journalists and 'good' journalism. This is about getting facts as right as possible, helping inform, acting in good faith, adding value, providing a service, employing critical analysis. We need to be informed about our world and the decisions of respective governments – without 'good' journalism we would be informed about neither and may be misinformed about either or both.
Wed 19	<b>Mass 10.00am</b> Alphege, Archbishop of Canterbury 1012 St Alphege Church in London represents those many churches destroyed in war. We pray for their worshipping communities. Alphege was also Abbot of Bath, Bishop of Winchester and Archbishop of Canterbury, then killed by Vikings.
Thurs 20	Pray for all volunteers who give time and energy to so many different activities. Remembering that without volunteers many of the support services would simply not function.
Fri 21	<b>Mass 10.00am</b> Anselm, Abbot of Le Bec Archbishop of Canterbury 1109. Pray for theologians and those who help understand our faith and the purpose of our existence. Giving thanks for Anselm, originator of the ontological argument for existence of God, and 'satisfaction theory' of atonement.
Sat 22	Pray for our planet. In particular all those who work to positively impact on the environmental and ecological issues we face at local and global levels.
<b>Sunday 23</b>	<p><b>Easter Three</b></p> <p>Almighty Father, who in your great mercy gladdened the disciples with the sight of the risen Lord: give us such knowledge of his presence with us, that we may be strengthened and sustained by his risen life and serve you continually in righteousness and truth.</p> <p><b>Early Worship 9.00am</b>                      <b>Parish Mass 10.30am</b></p>
