# The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (15<sup>th</sup> August)

Tuesday, August 15<sup>th</sup>, is the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Here we will celebrate this with a Festival Mass at 7.30pm.



The Feast dates back as early as the fifth century and the Assumption is one of the oldest holy days in the Church. It recalls both the happy departure of Our Lady from this earthly life and the lifting of her body into heaven. It provides a foretaste of our own bodily resurrection at the end of time. There's an interesting difference between 'assumed' and 'ascended'. Some people think that people believe Mary "ascended" into heaven. This isn't correct. Christ, by His own power, ascended into Heaven. Mary was assumed, or taken up into Heaven, by God. She didn't do it under her own power.

In the Roman Catholic Church it was on 1 November 1950 that Pope Pius XII declared a dogma of the Church "that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory." The Assumption is a truth of salvation history that requires our belief and assent.

#### How does this thinking impact our own lives?

It is perhaps more important for us to think about the symbolic meaning of this event rather than accept the Catholic dogma or see this as an actual event. Though we need to remember that many people do indeed accept the latter point.

If we live with our gaze fixed toward the Heavenly Kingdom (as we have been hearing about recently in Matthew's parables) we will one day share in this same glory and the earth will become more aligned to God's purpose.

Consequently, we must not lose our serenity and peace even amongst the thousands of daily difficulties and challenges. For many, the '*luminous sign of Our Lady taken up into Heaven*' shines out even more brightly when sad shadows of suffering and violence seem to loom on the horizon.

#### **Indigenous Peoples and the USPG**

During the last week we have been following the USPG (United Society Partners in the Gospel) prayer cycle for Indigenous Peoples. USPG's role has always been to contribute to and encourage the development of the Anglican Church – and more recently the United Churches – around the world.

Over the centuries it has done this in different ways, but always with the aim of seeing churches thrive to become autonomous members of the Anglican Communion, contributing to both the life of the Anglican Church and the country they are part of. The rapidly changing world of the mid-20th century, and particularly decolonisation, challenged traditional mission thinking and activity. This led to the developing of new concepts which emphasised the interdependence of the world church with relationships becoming those of equal partners. In the late 20th and early 21st centuries, USPG's role has increasingly become one of facilitation, enabling the movement of ideas, resources and people around the world church.

USPG campaigns are about climate justice, slavery, vaccine hesitancy and the plight of indigenous peoples.

#### **Indigenous Peoples**



Indigenous Peoples are inheritors and practitioners of unique cultures and ways of relating to people and the environment. They have retained social, cultural, economic and political characteristics that are distinct from those of the dominant societies in which they live. Despite their cultural differences, Indigenous Peoples from around the world share common problems related to the protection of their rights as distinct peoples.

Indigenous Peoples have sought recognition of their identities, way of life and their right to traditional lands, territories and natural resources for years, yet throughout history, their rights have always been violated. Indigenous Peoples today, are arguably among the most disadvantaged and vulnerable groups of people in the world. The international community now recognizes that special measures are required to protect their rights and maintain their distinct cultures and way of life.



She will be appearing in back-to-back, fully-staged operas from September, starting with *Ariodante* by Handel, in which she will be playing the title role!




