




Let's Talk Dementia

It's amazing, you think you have all the time in the world to prep for the Salisbury Flower Festival and then you blink and its here. Jo Low and I from the flower team were invited to do a design for the flower festival 'The Spirit of Water' at Salisbury Cathedral.

We were asked to interpret the first miracle - Water into Wine.

Quite a tricky subject and I wanted to avoid using wine bottles and be quite contemporary. The end design featured a vine mesh around 5 tall cylinders showing the transition from clear water to red wine with flowers mirroring the colour change around the water and live grape vine decorating the letters H20

Set up day on Monday saw over 500 flower arrangers converge on the cathedral. The Cathedral had a real floral buzz. An early start for Jo and I, our arrival slot time was 9am. Fortunately everything travelled safely with no breakages and I hadn't forgotten anything (it does happen).

We cracked on and within 2 hours everything was done and we could breath and do a quick tour of what else was being created.

The fishes created by local school children using donations which All Saints parishioners had contributed to are particularly effective.

An exhausting but immensely satisfying day with the cherry on the top of our design featuring in Points West Report that night. Just got to go back to Salisbury on Sunday evening to take it all down.


