### St John's School Special

#### Foundation Governors for St John's School



We have three Foundation Governors: Fr Charles, Caroline Davenport and Jonathan Frere. Additionally, Janice Callow and Fr Charles regularly lead the St John's Service (Assembly).

As Foundation Governors one of our duties is to monitor the delivery of **Religion and World Views**, and **Collective Worship** (sometimes known as Assembly or as Service).

Religion and World Views is a statutory subject that is part of the basic curriculum for schools, but it is not in the National Curriculum. The Religion and World Views curriculum is determined at Local Authority level. The Local Authority must establish an Agreed Syllabus which is followed by all schools in their area. The Diocese also provides resources and training. At St John's children learn about Christianity, exploring questions such as What kind of world did Jesus want? What does it mean if God is holy and loving? What do we understand by Salvation? They also learn about Islam, Hinduism, Sikhism and Humanism as they progress through the school, there are visits to a local mosque, gurdwara, temple as well as All Saints and other Christian churches.

The term **Collective Worship** encapsulates its purpose of bringing everyone together, of all faiths and none, for the purpose of examining what, as a school with a distinctively Christian ethos, we hold worthy of consideration and reflection. This may include themes and topics drawn from other cultures and beliefs. It is fundamental in reinforcing school values and helping to create a sense of belonging. Although children may be withdrawn from Service if the parents/carers so wish, this rarely happens. All the churches close to the school provide people to lead Collective Worship.

Each week has a central 'question which is published in the weekly bulletin for parents and carers. A recent example was 'In services this week, we have been helping ourselves and others to 'fly high like an eagle' by reflecting on these questions: This week is Refugee Week. How can we show friendship to refugees and others?

#### St John's School culture and direction

Foundation Governors are also full members of the Governing Body of the School. Consequently, we are fully engaged in determining the school's strategic future and in enabling the school improvement plan. Not forgetting that this is an outstanding school with a fantastic culture and atmosphere. The quality of the Senior Leadership Team, the teacher and staff and all who work at the school shines through the very life of the school.

Over the course of this year, working alongside the Senior Leadership Team (who also carried out lesson observations and 'book-looks') Father Charles and Caroline have taken part in gathering pupils' views of the teaching and learning of these elements of the curriculum.

We found that the children interviewed on the subject of **Collective Worship** said they enjoyed it, especially as it was different to classroom lessons and that they learned interesting things.

The Junior children mentioned that they valued learning about all sorts of things during Collective Worship, including, for example: autism and ADHD. It was particularly important to them in that they learned to understand other people. They liked the fact that everyone came together (for Collective Worship), and that it was generally a quieter, reflective time when they did not feel any pressure to answer questions but enjoyed hearing different opinions and taking part in various ways. Several mentioned the singing and music associated with Service as enjoyable. This demonstrates that Collective Worship is fundamental in reinforcing school values and helping to create a sense of belonging.

Additionally, to the 'Whole School' services held in the Hall, classes hold their own weekly service in their classroom, with pupils providing music, topics and framework. This helps to build values such as respect, friendship and collaboration on a smaller scale, and can strengthen relationships and a sense of belonging within the class. It also gives opportunities for performance and self-expression within a 'safe space'.

### St. John's Ofsted Report

#### Letter from Justin Hoye, Headteacher and Alice Ballard, Chair of Governors

Dear All,

Following our recent Ofsted inspection at the end of last term, I am writing to share with you the final report and thank you for your continued support and partnership. We are delighted to let you know that our school has once again received **Outstanding** judgements in the following areas:

- Behaviour and attitudes
- \* Personal development
- Leadership and management
- Early years provision

These results are a true reflection of the hard work, skill and care of our staff, the enthusiasm and kindness of our pupils, and the incredible support from you, our families. Ofsted no longer gives schools a single overall one-word judgement (such as 'Outstanding' or 'Good'). Instead, schools are now graded separately in key areas, which provides a more detailed picture of our strengths and priorities for development. We are especially proud that our school has been recognised as a place where children flourish both academically and personally.

While there has been a shift in the 'Quality of Education' judgement from Outstanding to Good, we are proud that the school remains in a very strong position and that educational provision has improved since the last inspection.

The inspection was carried out under Ofsted's more rigorous new framework and reflects the evidence gathered during a short visit. We are pleased that the report recognises our proactive approach, noting that we have already 'accurately identified key areas for development.' Like all schools, we are committed to continual improvement and are already making progress in these areas. Although we had hoped for an even higher outcome, we are delighted that the report celebrates our many strengths, including the 'magical experience' of reading and our 'uncompromising drive to give pupils a high-quality education.'

We are thrilled that our focus on children's personal development, attitudes and happiness comes through so strongly in the report. We wholeheartedly believe that this is at the heart of primary education and setting children up for the future. Recognising that St. John's is a place where 'pupils thrive' is important to us and important to you. The exceptional feedback from our families with 100% of parents/carers saying they would recommend St. John's (Ofsted Parent View 2024/25) is a testament to the trust and confidence you place in our school every day.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for all of your ongoing support and time for our children and our community. Huge appreciation to all the staff who work tirelessly every day to provide such great learning experiences, surrounded by enrichment and care. Also, to all our governors who give up their time and make such a significant contribution to the leadership and strategic direction of the school. Finally, to our children who make every day varied, exciting and fun — it is you who make our work so worthwhile, thank you.

We know this report comes at a time when we are welcoming new families and preparing for the next academic year. Please be assured that our commitment to providing an excellent, nurturing, and ambitious education for every child remains unchanged. We are proud of our outstanding culture, will continue to build on our strengths and give your children the fullest education in the very special place that is St. John's.


#### **For Dedication Sunday**

Everyone, their friends and their dog, welcome.


Saturday 12th July


