All Saints was established as a Christian worshipping community and will always remain so. As Christians we are called to spread Christ's word to our neighbours and the community we live in. But how do we do that? What does All Saints look like from the outside? What does our very beautiful building prominently situated in the heart of the city represent to those in the community and those walking by?

The Church and Community Group was established after Covid restrictions eased, to promote a range of activities to bring together church and community and to address some of those questions. It has the following objectives:

'To contribute to the missionary activities of All Saints, to support those who are members of the All Saints Community who worship here, and also to become an active presence within the local community and the wider community.'

There are currently 9 members in the group and we meet about every 6 weeks to review regular activities which are led by members of the group, and to discuss and plan new events. We also have a number of loyal and supportive members who are the back- up team for various events.

Current activities which are open to all:-

- Monthly walks on the first Saturday of each month (see below)
- Friends Together Cafe, which meets on first Thursday of each month (see below)
- Parish lunches and social gatherings
- Fund raising events, e.g. for the Sudanese students supported by All Saints.
- Weekly Pub evenings at the Alma Tavern
- Book Group, which meets every 2 months
- Oversight of the food bank.

Also a spotlight on Friends Together cafe, which is on the first Thursday of each month and is an extremely valuable resource for those with memory problems, carers and friends.

Friends Together Dementia Friendly Café is a vital part of the All Saints Church & Community Group, warmly welcoming people from our congregation, parish, and beyond.

Friends Together Dementia Friendly Café is a warm, welcoming space, open to everyone, but primarily for people living with dementia, their carers, and loved ones. Held on the first Thursday of every month and offering delicious homemade cakes and hot drinks, the Café provides support, companionship, conversation, and one-to-one help from dedicated volunteers.

No booking is required, and there is no charge to attend. Strong ties with local healthcare professionals and support services, including the Bristol Dementia Wellbeing Partnership, and Carers Support Bristol & South Gloucestershire, help to signpost visitors to further, community-based support to enhance wellbeing and quality of life.





As we move forward, we glance back over our shoulder. Churches have played a central part in community life for centuries.

On the 6th of July this year we, at All Saints, celebrate the 157th Anniversary of the consecration and the 58th Anniversary of the dedication of our church. Many will remember with great fondness the organisations, the clubs and activities that existed, whether at All Saints, or churches elsewhereScouts, Guides, Brownies, Cub, Youth Clubs, Mothers Union, Young Wives and so on. Many of these have become less significant or no longer exist. Times have changed and we, at All Saints have to move forward.

The need for friendship, community support and the desire to belong has not gone away, and out challenge is to meet it.

Taking a broader perspective, All Saints is mindful of the need to contribute to the broader agendas, with particular reference to the Governments levelling up agenda. Central to levelling - up is a concern with "anchor institutions", which are defined as organisations that make an important contribution to place-building.

There are 12 places for the Parish pilgrimage to Walsingham , 6th-10th Oct. As previously noted this will be led by Mthr Nicola


The cost will be £400 per person, for dinner, bed and breakfast (not including lunches). Double and single rooms available, costs are the same. Transport costs are additional (see below).


