



5	Fabric and atrium project	 CWs have met with the architect, Marcus. Following the investigative work done recently, concrete was found under the paving stones in the atrium. This means we can use thinner stone for the floor. Samples of grey and yellow stone were passed round with the proposed plan. A 'visual pathway' round the atrium proposed. Stones can be sealed to avoid staining. Acoustic ceiling tiles, (fire retardant) proposed to provide 2 inches of insulation. Lights would be tracked inside this. Courtyard: suggestion that it is paved similarly to the front piazza. Floor to be raised to make it accessible. If we can recycle the slabs from the atrium to reduce concrete use, that would fit with our aims for net zero. To get a faculty in July, we need to apply quickly. Please study the plan and contact Martin with any queries by Sunday. Fr Charles explained that once we have a Faculty we can go out to tender, with a fixed cost contract. The Trustees will then be applied to for the funds. The aims of the project are: to move us towards Net zero, community, accessibility, renewal work to make the church fit for the 21st century. Possible time scale: an optimistic estimate would see the project finished by Oct 2026 when Fr Charles leaves. Fr Charles thanked all those who have been involved with the project. An enormous amount of work has gone into it, with Adam Chivers as well as the churchwardens continuing to work on the project.
